**This 1729 German Bible** was used in the first church located near our present church.



The first called pastor was Rev. J.H. Smith. He was installed January 1866, at the same time as the first church was dedicated. There were two German services a month and two English services. The Bible was presented to the church by Rose Weis Seiler to be used for the reading of the Word. Her family, Mr. and Mrs. Michael Weis, donated the property.

## Fun Information from the Archives

WHAT A TIME! by Corinne Bollinger

The amount we owe to our early pastors can never be overestimated. Pastors Mechling, Worley, J.H. Smith, Potts, McMurray, J.L. Smith and Wismer. They preached services in German and English, alternately, held twice a month at the most. Catechetical class was instructed and confirmed every second year, and communion could be administered only two times yearly.

- Add to this the handicap of widely separated congregations at Ligonier, Youngstown, New Derry and Latrobe, connected only by roads that were in turn hot and dusty, rutted and muddy, or ice covered and nigh impassable.
- Add to this a willingness to answer all calls on their services, regardless of time or elements, when travel was only by horseback or horse and buggy.
- Add to this traveling on a dark and stormy night to a distant part of the parish.

Those pastors did not hesitate to make the dangerous, dark and stormy ride. Maybe many miles, over muddy roads, forging raging streams, through snow, rain, ice or hail to council the sick, administer to the dying, or to bury the dead. And there was very little cash remuneration for the heroism of our church's leaders.

All this was done for "the salvation of souls, the extension of the church and the advancement of the glory of God."

**Treasurer's January 2015 Scorecard Report**

- **Cash Flow** for the month of January 2015 was a negative (\$4,210.71) which was worse than expected by (\$3,570.71).
- **Total Expenses** were under budget by \$4,937.85 due primarily to timing differences between budgeted costs and actual costs with respect to personnel raises, Committee expenses and IT related Office Cost expenses.
- The favorable expense variances, albeit timing related, were not sufficient to overcome a very significant **Total Income** shortfall of (\$8,508.56).

**Council Minutes: February 17, 2015**

**Communications:** Thank you from Trinity North Side who received 15 children's Christmas gifts; from Pr. Morgan for Trinity's 2015 Mission Support commitment. Trinity is trying to reach the Synod's 12% goal.

**Ministry Report:** Pr. Schock thanked the 30 youth and adults from KDO who helped with the pancake dinner. On 3/8 Trinity youth are hosting Sunday Night Live. Youth taking donations for personal hygiene items for Union Mission. Devotion books were mailed to every home. People are responding to the challenge to invite 3 people. Investigating the Boiler issue. All of the children's choir was present to sing on the very cold snowy Sunday am service.

**Treasurer's Report:** 54 people present at cong. meeting. January's giving on track; concern with non-pledge giving. Discussion on how to reach out to new members as well as those who haven't attended in a while.

**Call Committee:** Met with Pr. Sheehan; beginning to fill out the Ministry Site Profile; discussed vision for this person's responsibilities & characteristics needed to align with Trinity's goals.

**Ad Hoc:** 150th anniv: Composers to write special music; guest preachers lined up; plans for July 4th float; special booklet underway; new time capsule discussed; Coloring book planned.

**Unfinished business:** Treasurer qualifications discussed. Child protection policy being updated.

**New Business:** Weather: notices sent to local radio and TV stations and also posted on Trinity's webpage. Policy in place regarding cancellation of church services.

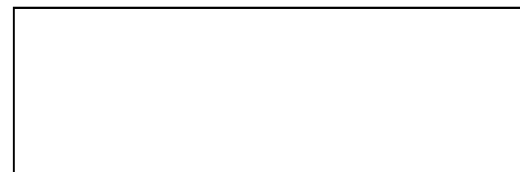
